- 1. Call to Order at 9:07 am
- 2. Presentation of Pro Bono Certificates Justice Hart from the Colorado Supreme Court.

Justice Hart from the Colorado Supreme Court was present on behalf of the Colorado State commission for the Access to Justice Commission. Colorado Supreme Court has a pro bono pledge of 50 hours per Colorado lawyer, the firm overall is asked to contribute 50 hours per attorney in the firm. Their commission has been successful in reaching people in Denver but not as much outside of that area. Justice Hart presented certificates to the following attorneys/firms who contributed at least 50 hours of pro bono service last year:

Jeffrey Newton Rosenberg, Smith and Zipser PLLC

Justice Hart indicated that the commission has found that outside of Denver attorneys are not participating in the pledge program but they find that many attorneys are providing hundreds of hours of pro bono work and being recognized locally but not being recognized more broadly. Justice Hart's goal is to try to highlight the work that is being done in areas outside of Denver and who are recognized locally but not more broadly. Justice Hart indicated the commission also focuses on the judicial rules that support and allow individuals to provide pro bono service including those rules about how individuals can obtain legal advice.

- 3. Access to Justice Rebekah Berry-Chaney
 - Family Law Resource Day held in April served 76 people, 14 of those were walk-ins with 20 attorneys who volunteered their time. Those volunteers were recognized by name.
 - Ask-a-Lawyer day is coming up on October 25th and civil and domestic relations attorney volunteers are still needed.
- 4. Court Resource Center: Ian Bonner

The Court Resource Center has been extremely busy as of late. Last August 793 people were helped which is a record exceeding July 2019 which is the next busiest month on record in which 756 people were helped. Mr. Bonner reminds the bar that the Court Resource Center was rebranded from the Self Help Center because the expectation was that individuals would receive legal advice from court staff. Mr. Bonner reminds the bar that the Court Resource Center's hours are 8am to 4pm, Monday, Wednesday and Friday and from 8am to 2pm on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Of note, the number of non-native English speakers assisted last year was only 35, however, this year 66 people helped. Mr. Bonner credits having a second full time interpreter on hand with the reason they have been able to assist more individuals Have 2nd full time interpreter on hand which has assisted. Ben Roacha and Isleen Ramsa Have moved away from Probate because not enough litigant interest in probate matters.

The legal clinic is generally held on 2nd Tuesday of each month. Evacuation drill this month so this month's is rescheduled to 9/17. There is still a need for a family law attorney from 3-5pm on 9/17, please contact Ian or Tina. Mr. Bonner reports there are rarely any slots that were empty with the exception of probate. Court Resource Center's classes include:

- Pro se domestic relations class on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday of the month few people per week
- Eviction class: 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month primarily on how to start an eviction because that is where most

5. Pro Bono Program – Ben Kramer and Cody Knebel

Designed to serve low income residence in Larimer County, weekly intakes in Fort Collins and Loveland and monthly class.

- 427 people 22 resulted in extended representation
- 72 people on the classes
- Both classes and intakes staffed by attorneys
- Encourages new attorneys to consider limited representation for temporary orders or emergency hearings
- Thank you to attorneys who attend intakes, over 100 who participate

6. State of the Judiciary – Chief Judge Stephen Howard

Can email Justice Hart or Jackie Marro to participate in the pro bono service program to receive recognition. The state of the judiciary is fabulous! And also chaotic.

In the area of access to justice, one thing we don't hear a lot about is about Criminal law, many people who don't qualify for court appointed counsel and who can't afford an attorney so encourage criminal defense attorneys to get on the modest means list.

Judge Howard reports there is a lot of change at the Justice Center. After September 30th it will still be a great day to be alive but Magistrate Jostad will not be here to remind us as he is retiring. Judge Howard thanks Magistrate Jostad for his service. Magistrate Dina Christiansen will be taking over for Magistrate Jostad as of October 1st and will begin with the pre-decree domestic relations docket.

There will be an announcement for a new judicial officer. The appointment committee will be meeting on November 5. Class on "so you want to be a judge" September 16th at 12pm in the Jury room.

New courtroom will begin construction: Court staff are in the process and packing up to move into the old law library space, aka the space where Probation is currently located. Probation is in the process of moving out and court staff will move in. Jury assembly is anticipated to be chaotic because there will not be substantial space so jury members will be assigned to go to a courtroom when they arrive. Will have an expanded jury assembly area because of the increased number of trials and 2C will be in the area that now contains the jury assembly area and will be Magistrate Spangler's courtroom. 2A will become Magistrate Zehe's courtroom.

Loveland probation will not be moving.

November election ballot will have a ballot initiative to widen I-25 and widening the courthouse. If it passes it will still be several years before the courthouse might expand. The challenge is in deciding how to expand as the land to the west is owned by the county and to the south is owned by the city.

The legislature has been very active in the past year. Encourage any who might be thinking of running for the legislature to do so as there are almost no lawyers who are in the legislature. Of note:

• Senate Bill 191 would have required statewide weekend bond hearings. Someone recognized the significant cost and it was amended. Larimer county submitted our report on how would implement but it will be very expensive both from the court staff perspective and also from the sheriff's office.

• There are 2 statutes on competency – one tries to accelerate competency determinations.

The bridges program being operated in a trial basis on Judge Lynch and Judge Lehman's office. They are appointing a liaison to facilitate mental health services which would be an information service in the courts Mental health diversion program re minor offenses that are being operated on in a trial basis in 4 districts including ours.

New judge Chelsey Gringle will be starting in mid September in Jackson County. There were no lawyers in Jackson county before but she is a lawyer and she will be moving to the area.

In the past DR cases assigned to one week- Process ending by end of the year. District Court judges will handle the setting of the trials and the pre-trial conference. Hoping this will allow the hearings to proceed faster. Looking at changing case assignment for district court judges which will probably take effect March 1.

State Court Administrator resigned as well as many of the top people in that office. Has reached equilibrium but they are somewhat shorthanded. A week ago Monday the committee met on applications.

7. National Adoption Day – Donna Hochberg

Will be held on November 22nd but it won't be able to hold it here at the courthouse because of the construction. If you know anyone thinking of being adopted, that would be a great day to do it. Heidi Whitaker has agreed to lead this program. Please see Heidi if you want to help with this program. Donna Hochberg used to lead this program for many years and we are grateful for her service.

8. Treasurer's Report – Kara Clark

Under budget last fiscal year, have plenty of money in county, approved another donation to CLS which will be presented at March term day.

2019/2020 budget was created in July and approved which included an increase in Cindy Hendrix salary and a few changes. The balanced budget has a surplus of \$140 dollars. See Anda if you would like to see the budget.
