#### LCBA Term Day March 1, 2019

- 1. Call to Order—Renee Doak
- 2. State of the Judiciary—Judge Stephen Howard.

The State of the Judiciary in a word is busy.

Judge Villasenor is new to the jurisdiction, he is in a 2-week jury trial and is unavailable to attend this morning. On Monday 2/25, there were a number of long jury trials and there were 390 jurors for those trials. The Court had to do jury orientation in court rooms, administration and the deputies did a great job with logistics. On Wednesday 2/27 7 jury trials were scheduled. and for better or worse a criminal defendant didn't appear, or a conference room would have been used for a jury room because we only have 6 jury rooms. To a small extent we anticipate that these issues will be addressed. There is a bill in the legislature for 15 new judges, one in this district. With the amendment we should have a new judge as of Jan 1, 2020. We currently have no space for a judge. The issue we have been dealing with is where will we put another court room? The plan is that the new judge will be in 4D which is currently the JD courtroom, we will move JD court to 2A, which is currently the D&N court, but we need a secure elevator for the juveniles in custody, and then the D&N court has to relocated. Ideas include moving probation or the DAs office. We are moving much of probation out of the courthouse leaving part of the 1st floor, although there is no place on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor suitable for a court room. The current plan is to find a place for probation, then they have to do construction and move probation. We will create a new jury assembly area on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor and the current jury assembly room will be a new courtroom, and judicial administration will move to the 1<sup>st</sup> floor.

There is construction at the Loveland courthouse, additional space is being created for probation, the wellness center and day reporting. The staff will be impacted but not the courtrooms. We are hoping to have a bill on the ballot to fund an expanded courthouse expanding either to the South (land owned by the city) or to the West (land owned by the County).

There were a couple of bills passed by the legislature and we anticipate a lot of changes. The last session there was legislation for a mental health diversion pilot program where lower level crimes can be diverted out of the criminal justice center—it is primarily oriented to people in custody to make room in the jail (which is being expanded). We are one of four districts who are piloting this program. It was supposed to go into effect the 1<sup>st</sup> of the year which wasn't realistic, we are now shooting for March 25<sup>th</sup>. Summit stone will be the primary provider and we have entered into an agreement with them.

Bridges Program—geared towards competency in criminal cases. Statewide program. Any attorney who might need mental health issues there will be a liaison who can provide referrals for services.

Effective April 15<sup>th</sup> we are piloting pro se e-filing in DR cases. There has been discussion of doing away with DR trial week. We have been working on that, but because we will almost certainly have a new judge may delay that change. We do intent not to have more

than the current number of judges handling criminal cases so that we don't need new Das as a result of having an additional judge. There is discussion about trying to reallocate the way we do case assignments in general. There will be a change as to how DR cases are addressed but what that will be and when is TBD.

#### 3. Treasurer's Report—Art Spicciati

Treasury is solid, there are plenty of funds, we are moving according to budget. There have been no unique events that have damaged the finances of the bar. We moved some money around to take advantage of rising interest rates. Our income is based on dues which is strong based upon a growing bar. At the last term day meeting, the treasurer discussed endowing the scholarship fund, the board asked for responses from the general membership, all responses were in support of the endowment, we did adopt the resolution to endow the scholarship fund. The bar association now has a debit card.

#### 4. Access to Justice—Rebekah Berry-Chaney

The committee helps to expand access to justice for civil matters. Committee maintains list of local resources, featured on the website. Compile and maintain modest means attorney list (modest means isn't defined by the bar—low pay, slow pay, flexible retainers)

2 annual events, Family Law Day (spring)—this is coming up in April. Ask A Lawyer Day (Fall)—127 people registered, 122 came in the fall 2018. There was a low return of the surveys, but the feedback we did receive was positive. 24 attorneys volunteered for the event.

There are quarterly meetings, all are invited. All meetings are on Thursday between 12-1, next meeting will be 3/21, the bar association's event calendar will have the other dates. The committee would welcome judicial officers.

#### 5. Court Resource Center—Ian Bonner and Tina Gomez

Court Resource Center re-branded from the Self-Help Center in hopes to minimize confusion regarding what people would receive through the center. Updated hours, M/W/F 8-4 and T/Th 8-2. There are appointments on Thursdays if people need more help. On average the center helps 650 people, mostly in person meetings but also there is assistance via phone and e-mail. The center hosts a monthly Ask A Lawyer Clinic on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of the month from 3-5. DR, Civil and Probate attorneys are available during that time. The next Ask A Lawyer day is on March 12<sup>th</sup>.

April 5<sup>th</sup> is the upcoming Family Law Day. All services are available in English and Spanish. 59 people were served last year, 70 people were served two years ago, the hope is to have a higher number again as it is earlier in the year.

#### 6. Board of Governors—Jennifer Rice

The DBA/CBA has moved! There is no longer parking next the bar, the recommendation is people park in the cultural parking center and walk across the square. Colorado has the 2<sup>nd</sup> lowest bar dues, and we have the 3<sup>rd</sup> highest voluntary bar membership in the country. The list

serves have gotten changed over to a better, more user-friendly format. There is financial asst. for aged/infirmed/incapacitated attorneys. The Modern Law Practice initiative is working on increasing profitability and decreasing overhead. There is a push for broadband to saturate the state more for the purposes of access to justice. It would take 40 billion to reach 98% of Colorado Counties, but it would take the equivalent amount of money to reach the remaining 2%. The bar is working to get more broadband to the rest of the state, so people have more access to justice/judicial resources.

#### 7. Annual Ethics Seminar—Jennifer Rice for Magistrate Jostad

The event is April 17, the expectation is 4 ethics credits. There will be 2 attorneys discussing referral services and client files, Eli Wald will be presenting as will Judge Villasenor.

#### 8. Legal Aid Foundation—Roger Clark

Active areas with respect to Access to Justice. Colorado Legal Services receives significant support from the Legal Aid Foundation. If you haven't contributed, please consider doing so.

#### Pro Bono Program—Ben Kramer

Pro Bono is moving to electronic records. So far this year 83 people have been served and 7 people have been matched with attorneys this year. There are people who have consistently offered pro bono/reduced fee services who are retiring so there is significant need for services especially in DR. If you take on a pro bono case it can be eligible for CLE credits.

#### 9. Women's Bar—Elyse Ritchie

Next meeting is 3/28 at 11:30 at Nick's Italian. A President and VP will be nominated at that time. If you are interested, please let Elise or another board member know. Erin Connor, the current VP cannot be President next year.

#### 10. Young Lawyers Division—Fred Long

Law Day, May 1<sup>st</sup> is one of the bigger YLD events. The theme is "Free Speech, Free Press and Free Society" YLD is looking for a speaker and are open to suggestions. The CLE event will be at the Rio again this year, they are hoping for 1-2 CLE credits. Mock trial participants will be honored at that time as well.

Legal Professionalism Month is in October. Friday mornings we get together for coffee/donuts and look for various law firms to host the event. Please let Fred know if you are interested in hosting.

Call A Lawyer. Dan St. John is the contact for the event, if there are questions please contact him.

Looking to expand outreach and to include young lawyers in Weld County as well as Larimer County. Looking for more involvement with public sector young lawyers (DAs, PDs, clerks etc).

Monthly meetings are on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of the month. The next meeting is 3/20.

#### 11. Inns of Court—Renee Doak for Doug Stratton

Bryan White Inns of Court is a group of lawyers, judges, magistrates in Larimer and Weld County who meet in Loveland. Membership is not required, and attendance is always welcome.

#### 12. Mock Trial—Ian McCargar for Magistrate Connors

This event is one of the only collaboration events between the Larimer and Weld County Bar Associations. There were 11 teams this year at the Weld County Courthouse. Lawyers make the best scoring jurors, especially litigators, please consider volunteering and if you volunteer please make sure to show up.

Fort Collins HS won, Ridgeview (2 teams) will be competing at the state competition in Golden. Scoring and presiding judges are needed for the statewide competition. Please consider volunteering.

#### 13. Stephen J Roy Scholarship Fund—Ian McCargar

As was mentioned, we did endow that scholarship so a fraction of the balance will be carved off and made available to us (not a fixed amount, a fixed percentage) we will have a good idea of how much money we can award to deserving high school kids.

The proceeds from the professionalism seminar goes towards the scholarship fund, please consider attending!

#### 14. Mentorship Program—Ian McCargar

The mentorship program is still alive and well in Larimer County. There are a lot of younger/newer/less experienced lawyers seeking mentors. Please volunteer if you would like to be a mentor. Most folks are just looking for someone they can call informally.
